CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) – PRESS RELEASE

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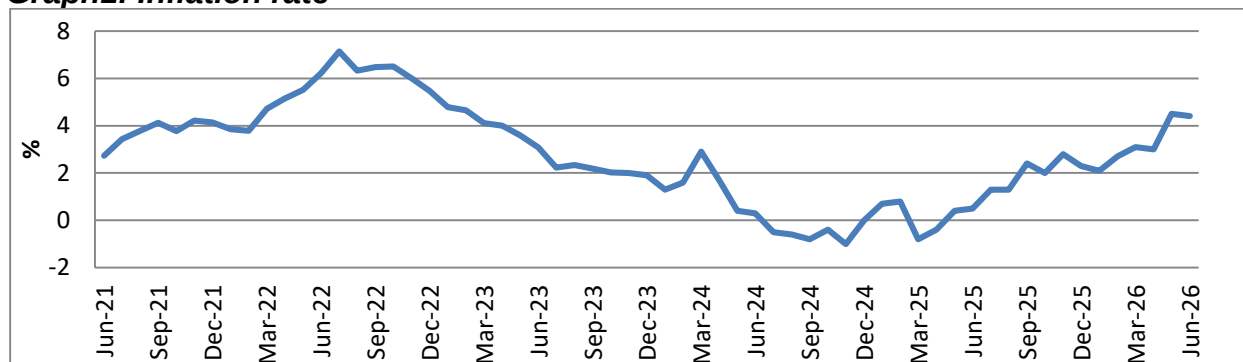
Nassau, The Bahamas - August 30th 2026 - The Bahamas National Statistical Institute (BNSI) is pleased to announce the release of its Consumer Price Index (CPI) Report for June 2026. The inflation rate is measured as the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between two periods and reflects the average change in prices of goods and services purchased by households over time.

The monthly inflation rate in The Bahamas decreased by 0.1 percent in June 2026 compared to May 2026, reflecting changes in the average prices of goods and services purchased by consumers during the period. This follows an increase of 0.6 percent recorded between April and May 2026.

On a month-to-month basis (June 2026 compared to May 2026), the largest decreases included Food and Non-alcoholic beverages (1.3 percent), Miscellaneous Goods and Services (0.4 percent), Clothing (0.4 percent), along with Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (0.3 percent). In contrast, the largest increase was recorded in the Health (2.2 percent) category. All other major groups remained unchanged.

On a year-over-year basis (June 2026 compared to June 2025), as illustrated in Graph 1 below, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for June 2026 increased by 4.3 percent compared to the same period in 2025. The primary categories contributing to the year-over-year increase were Restaurant and Hotels at 15.4 percent, Transport at 14.1 percent, and Furnishing, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance at 5.9 percent. In contrast, the category of Alcohol Beverages, Tobacco and Narcotics decreased by 3.1 percent.

The petroleum and diesel index showed month-over-month increase in June 2026, with petroleum prices rising by 2.05 percent and diesel prices decreasing by -0.6 percent relative to May 2026.

On an annual basis, both petroleum and diesel prices increased. Diesel recorded the larger increase at 46.3 percent, while petroleum prices rose by 26.7 percent over the same period.
